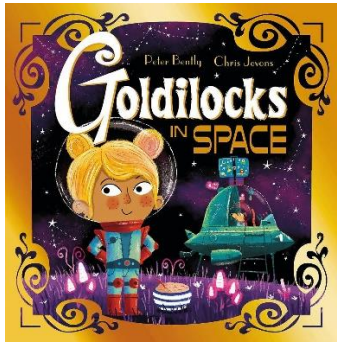
Across the school, we have collated lists of quality texts across a range of genres that will support the fluidity and progression of the essential reading skills, enabling all children to flourish.

Goldilocks in Space by Peter Bently

Recommended for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

I always love a twist on well-loved fairytales, and was so excited to find the Futuristic Fairy Tales.

Captain Goldilocks is on a mission to find a new planet that's just as good as Earth!

But everywhere she lands is too cold or too hot, too slimy or too scary, too wobbly or too full-of-aliens. Will she ever find a planet that's "just right"? This is the first book in the series, along with Snow White in Space.



The Fly High Crew by Ashley and Jordan Banjo

Recommended for Years 3 and 4

An alien invasion in school.... I was sold already!

Trey and Jax spend hours after-school rehearsing with their street-dance group: the Fly High Crew. That is, until the evening they see a green beam of light flash out of the sky and are thrown into an out-of-this-world adventure! Aliens have landed and are mind-controlling all the teachers and adults: can the Fly High Crew work together as a team and save the day?



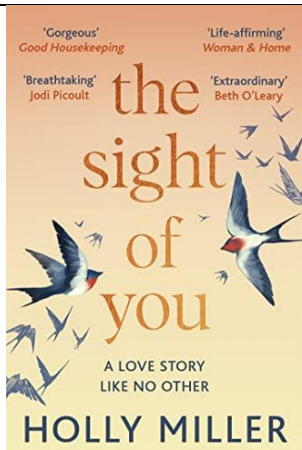
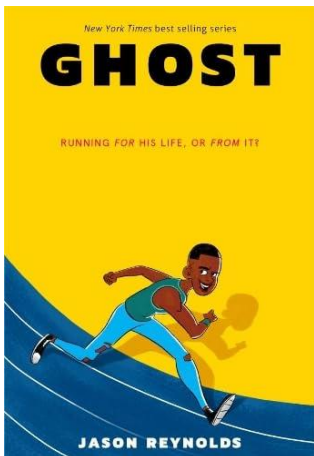
Ghost by Jason Reynolds

Recommended for Years 5 and 6

Wow – what a stunning novel about facing your fears, and I really found myself rooting for Ghost all the way through.

Aall Ghost (real name Castle Cranshaw) has ever known is running. But he has been running for the wrong reasons, until he meets an ex-Olympic Medallist who sees something in Ghost: crazy natural talent. If Ghost can stay on track, literally and figuratively, he could be the best sprinter in the city. Can Ghost harness his raw talent for speed, or will his past finally catch up to him?

This is the first book in the Run series: *Ghost. Lu. Patina. Sunny*. Four kids from wildly different backgrounds with personalities that are explosive when they clash. Four kids chosen for an elite middle school running team that could qualify them for the Junior Olympics if they can get their acts together. They all have a lot to lose and a lot to prove - not only to each other, but to themselves.



The Sight of You by Holly Miller

Recommended for grown-ups

This one is actually a recommendation from Mrs Cope as a book that she's re-read countless times!

Joel is haunted by dreams about the people he loves: visions of what's going to happen (the good and the bad). The only way to prevent them is to never let anyone close to him again.

Callie is still grieving the death of her best friend. From the moment Joel and Callie met, it feels like the start of something life-changing. Until Joel has a vision of how it's going to end...
